



## How to get your

## **Alabama Real Estate License**



**Step 1:** To qualify for a real estate license (Salesperson) in Alabama, you must meet all the state's requirements as outlined on the Alabama Real Estate Commission site <a href="https://arec.alabama.gov/arec/">https://arec.alabama.gov/arec/</a>

## They include:

- · You must be 19 years old and above
- · You must be a U.S. Citizen or lawful permanent resident
- · Show proof of bona fide residency in any state in the U.S.
- · Show proof of high school graduation or equivalent
- · Not have been convicted of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude
- Not have had a real estate application rejected or revoked in any state within the past 2 years
- **Step 2:** Complete the approved 60-hour Alabama real estate <u>pre-license course</u> within 1 year of start date.
- **Step 3:** Pass the Alabama and national licensing exam within six months of passing the pre-licensing course. You must pass the exam with a score of 70% or higher.
- **Step 4:** Submit an application for an Alabama Temporary Salesperson's license.
- **Step 5:** Complete the required 30-hour <u>post-license course</u>.
- **Step 6:** Submit your application for an Alabama Permanent Salesperson's license.

**Note:** It is important you submit the application within 90 days of your exam date, or the exam is null and void. Applications are located at <a href="https://www.arec.alabama.gov">www.arec.alabama.gov</a>

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
