



How to get your

Alaska Real Estate License



Step 1: To qualify for a real estate license (Salesperson) in Alaska, you have to meet all the state's requirements. To start with, you have to meet the state's salesperson pre-licensing education requirement as outlined on the Alaska Real Estate Commission.

They include:

- · You must be 19 years old and above.
- You must not be under indictment for a felony, forgery, theft, extortion, conspiracy to defraud others, or fraud, which in the judgment of the Commission, affects the individual's ability to practice as a real estate salesperson competently and safely.
- **Step 2:** Complete the required 40-hour of an Alaska state approved <u>pre-licensing real</u> estate course.
- **Step 3:** Successfully pass the salesperson licensing examination by scoring at least 75%.
- **Step 4:** Seek sponsorship from a real estate broker licensed in the state. Are you curious about how to choose the right broker for you?
- **Step 5:** You'll also need to obtain "Errors and Omissions Insurance."
- **Step 6:** Submit <u>application</u> for your Alaska Salesperson license within 6 months after passing the exam and pay the appropriate fees.
- Step 7: Complete required 30 hours of approved post-licensing education.

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
