



How to get your

Arkansas Real Estate License



Step 1: To qualify for a real estate license (Salesperson) in Arkansas, you have to meet all the state's requirements. To start with, you have to meet the state's Salesperson Pre licensing Education requirement as outlined on the <u>Arkansas Real Estate Commission</u> website:

They include:

- You must be 18 years of age and above
- · You must be a legal US citizen
- **Step 2:** You must successfully complete 60 hours of <u>pre-licensing education</u> from an accredited school licensed by the Arkansas Real Estate Commission.
- **Step 3:** Submit a <u>salesperson application</u> to the Arkansas Real Estate Commission.
- **Step 4:** You must receive an approval from the Arkansas Real Estate Commission for you to be able to sit for the exam.
- **Step 5:** You are required to pass the licensure exam with a score of at least 70%.
- **Step 6:** You will need to undergo a <u>criminal background check</u>.
- **Step 7:** You will need to send the required documents and fees to the Arkansas Real Estate Commission. This should be no later than 90 days after passing the examination.
- **Step 8:** You are required to complete 18 hours of post-licensing education by the end of your 6 months after licensing. Visit <u>post-license education</u> for more information.
